



Prof. Dr Erdal Yalcin has been Professor of International Economic Relations at Konstanz University of Applied Sciences (HTWG) since 2018. Before his appointment to the professorship, he was deputy director of the Ifo Center for International Economics at the Ifo Institute in Munich.

He received his PhD from the University of Tübingen on the role of uncertainty in foreign direct investment and export decisions. His research focuses on the role of uncertainty in international trade policy and on the evaluation of economic effects of trade agreements.

Among others, he analysed the potential long-term welfare effects of the Transatlantic Trade and Investment Partnership (TTIP) and the economic consequences of a deepened customs union between the EU and Turkey.

His current projects include the analysis of the economic consequences of sanctions, as well as the analysis of the EU Commission's legislative proposal for new anti-dumping methods.

He has published numerous articles and policy reports in the field of international economics. He regularly advises various European institutions and ministries.
